Eligibility: Upcoming 4th through 8th Graders; Students who have already taken part of Making Latin Fun (SPARC)

Cost: \$50

****A minimum of six students is required for the class to be offered.**

Latin will broaden students' knowledge, improve their vocabulary, strengthen their English grammar and make them aware of details. The course will include mythology, culture, vocabulary, songs, games, arts/crafts and formal instruction in an informal setting. Class size limited to 15 students.

Fine Tune Your Keyboarding Skills

Following an introduction in the use of the personal computer, printer and keyboarding software, the student will complete lessons 1 to 20 on the use of the alphabetic and numeric keys. This course is designed to polish keyboarding skills and increase proficiency in mastering the keyboard. Class size limited to 20 students.

Did you take Spanish I at your elementary school? Are you afraid to take the placement test into Spanish II? This course is designed to review and get you ready for the placement test. After finishing this course, a student should be prepared for the placement test. This course will allow students to take the placement test if they so desire. Class size is limited to 18 students.

Drama Performance and Technique

Eligibility: Upcoming 7th through 12th Graders

Cost: \$100 (two week course)

This two-week workshop centers upon theatrical performance. Students will audition, rehearse and ultimately perform a one-act play at the workshop's conclusion. Students will develop theatrical technique and utilize a variety of stage skills. Some of the skills that will be accented include diction, concentration, physical dexterity, projection and character analysis. The class will meet in Seton's auditorium.

Ten Sessions Meeting Once Per Week

Introduction to Suzuki Violin

Two group sessions for all students (meets on Saturday)

Note: Times will be set up for each group individually (early evening and Saturday times will be available)

Instructor: Laura Klein (a registered Suzuki teacher specializing in beginners)

Eligibility: Upcoming 1st through 3rd Graders. Parent participation is required.

Cost: \$300

Using the “mother tongue approach”, the Suzuki method begins teaching violin playing skills and techniques that will be used at the most advanced levels from the first lesson. Our students learn to play with a beautiful tone and posture from the beginning.

This class is an introduction to learning to play the violin and will feature semi-private lessons in a small group setting. The classes meet for one hour weekly at a time convenient for the group members. Three students per group.

Students will have a final full performance at the end of the session, August 13 with a rehearsal from 2:00-6:00 p.m. and 7:00 p.m. performance. Class size is limited to 50 students.
