## SCHOLARSHIP

### Better Business Bureau – Students of Integrity Scholarship

- This scholarship honors high school students who demonstrate a commitment to ethical behavior. It is designed to recognize and promote ethics and integrity in our community's youth. Up to five \$1,000 scholarships will be awarded and can be applied to your college education.
- Candidates for this award will be judged solely on how their essays display their firm understanding and commitment to ethics. This is not an academic scholarship. Students are required to address the essay question: "Describe an ethical situation you have faced in one of the following areas of your life: family, work, school or community".

## SUMMER OPPORTUNITIES

### American Red Cross – Leadership Development Center (LDC)

Date: July 15 – 18, 2010

Location: Thomas More College

- LDC is a 4 day, 3 night camp for students entering 8<sup>th</sup> through 12<sup>th</sup> grade. Students will be given the training to reach their fullest potential as leaders and leave a positive footprint within their communities. Participants attend workshops and sessions on Leadership, Public Speaking and Diversity. The students meet with an array of well known community leaders who share their experiences and advice. Additionally, students will participate in either a First Aid or CPR class to receive American Red Cross certification.

### The University of Akron – Summer Experience in Engineering (SEE UA)

### Boston University – PROMYS (Program in Mathematics for Young Scientists)

- PROMYS will offer an intensive experience in creative mathematical exploration to approximately 65 ambitious high school students with an exceptionally strong interest in mathematics. PROMYS is a six-week residential program, with a per-student cost of \$2,700. (Financial assistance is available.) ### Children’s Hospital – 2010 Summer for Sickle Cell Science Program

- The program is designed to involve young people in cutting-edge scientific research conducted in an academic medical center and to cultivate a continued interest in research related to sickle cell disease.
- This eight-week program offers a chance to learn, explore, and gain hands-on experience in a medical center research laboratory environment for 3 students. Students will be assigned mini-research projects or work with laboratory staff on ongoing research. Participants may earn a stipend of up to \$3,000 based on the number of hours they spend in the laboratory. Fellowships begin June 7 or 14 and last for eight weeks.
- Current juniors and seniors may apply. Applicants should have a record of strong academic achievement and demonstrated interest in the sciences. This is a highly competitive program; typically over 100 applications are received for 3 positions. Applications are available in the guidance office and **must be postmarked by March 30, 2010.**

### University of Dayton – Pre-Engineering Program (UD PEP)

- The UD PEP is a three-day, residential camp where students engage in engineering design activities, meet college faculty and students, and interact with peers from other high schools.
