## SCHOLARSHIPS

### Hamilton County Republican Party – Leadership Council Scholarship

- The scholarship winner will be selected based on the results of an essay contest offered to qualified, high school seniors in Hamilton County. The winning student will receive \$3,000 towards their college or higher education expenses.

- The essay can be no more than 1,500 words and must be submitted in 12 point font, double spaced. You will be required to respond to the following prompt: “What do you see as being the core values of the Republican Party, and how do you see those values working to improve the future of our country?”
- **Applications and essays are due no later than November 9.** Please stop by the guidance office for applications and scholarship guidelines.

#### Fireside Catholic Publishing – Fireside Essay Scholarship

- This scholarship recognizes outstanding Catholic High School seniors who are daily “putting their faith into action”. Five winners will receive \$1000 cash awards for writing a 750-word essay on how their religious education is influencing their lives.
- **Essays are due to your counselor by Friday, December 4.** Only one student from Seton will be nominated to participate in the next level of this scholarship competition.

#### Foundation for Individual Rights in Education (FIRE) – “Freedom in Academia” Essay Contest

- High school seniors are invited to write an in-depth essay explaining why free speech and First Amendment rights are crucial to higher education and how abuses of these rights harm the college experience. FIRE is looking for high school seniors to submit well-written essays on freedom of speech on college campuses.
- Essays should explain how college administrators betray liberty and violate students’ constitutional rights at American colleges and universities as documented by FIRE in two short documentaries (which can be viewed on FIRE’s website). Essays should be 700-1200 words. Awards range from \$1,000 to \$5,000.

#### Engineers Foundation of Ohio

- These scholarships are offered to outstanding high school students throughout Ohio who desire careers in engineering. To be eligible for these scholarships students must have at least a 3.0 GPA, and meet the minimum SAT (Math – 600, Reading – 500) or ACT (Math – 29, English – 25) test scores as set by the National Society of Professional Engineers. Additional criteria is specified for some scholarships. Please read each description carefully.
