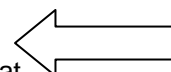

SCHOLARSHIPS

Please be aware that some of the scholarship deadlines listed below are the deadlines specified by the organization. You must submit all necessary materials to your counselor at least one week prior to their deadlines!

Miami Heights Civic Association – Ruth Siles Memorial Scholarship

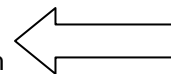
- The Miami Heights Civic Association will be offering four \$800 scholarships to deserving students of the Miami Heights area. The only criterion for eligibility is that the student be a high school senior who resides in Miami Heights.
- Applications are available in the guidance office and are **due by March 1, 2010**. Please note that this application requires a letter of recommendation from your counselor. Please be sure to ask for the letter well in advance of the scholarship deadline.

Mercy Hospital Western Hills Scholarships

- Mercy Hospital Western Hills presents three Tuition-Only \$1,000 Scholarships to local high school seniors planning to pursue a career in the **health field**. Also, a \$1500 Tuition-Only Scholarship will be awarded to a senior, who is a dependent of an employee of the hospital, with an interest in the health field.
- Interested students should see their counselor for an application. **The deadline for submitting applications is March 15, 2010.**



The Ohio Association of Criminal Defense Lawyers – James Kura Memorial Scholarship

- Students are required to write a 2 page essay on the topic “Should the terrorist suspects being tried in New York have the same constitutional rights as American citizens? Why or why not.”
- \$1,000 scholarships will be awarded to the top three essay writers. To qualify for the essay competition, you must have a 2.5 GPA. Interested students should see their counselor for an application as soon as possible. **Applications must be postmarked by February 19, 2010.**

Office of African American Catholic Ministries – Archbishop Karl J. Alter Scholarship

- The purpose of this scholarship is to assist graduating senior students in the Archdiocese of Cincinnati who are African American and Catholic to attend a college or university. The Archbishop Alter Scholarship is a four-year renewable grant (paid twice a year).
- Applications are available at www.catholiccincinnati.org/africanamericanministries. **The deadline for submitting applications is April 21, 2010.**

Best Buy @15 Scholarship Program

- The Best Buy @15 Scholarship Program is part of the fuel for the @15 mission. This year the program will award scholarships to students in grades 9-12 who plan to enter a full-time undergraduate course of study upon high school graduation. A total of 1,000 students will each receive a \$1,500 scholarship.
- To apply, students must have solid grades and must be involved in community service or have work experience. To apply online visit www.bestbuy.com/scholarships or www.at15.com. **The deadline to submit applications is February 15, 2010.**



The William D. Squires Scholarship

- The William D. Squires Educational Foundation is offering 12 scholarships, each worth up to \$12,000. The scholarship is primarily need-based; applicants must have an EFC under \$8,000.
- This scholarship is only available to students from Ohio. Applicants must have a minimum 3.2 GPA. Ideal candidates have already been working toward a specific career goal and are highly motivated, but require financial aid to pursue their goal of higher education.

National Society of High School Scholars Foundation – STEM Scholarship

- This foundation recognizes the need to produce more graduates with knowledge and skills in the Science, Technology, Engineering and Math (STEM) disciplines in order to meet the competitive challenges of the technology-driven global economy of the 21st century.
- Ten \$1000 STEM scholarships will be awarded for the 2010-2011 academic year. Eligibility requirements include high school seniors with a 3.5 minimum GPA. Recipients will be selected based on academic record, educator recommendation, personal statement, and list of STEM-related activities. Successful applicants must demonstrate a true commitment to the pursuit of a STEM college track.

SPECIAL PROGRAMS

Cincinnati Children's Hospital Medical Center – Summer Internship Program

- This program is for science students interested in pursuing a Medical Career. A total of 16 positions will be available with mentors from CCHMC and the University of Cincinnati in the adult care specialties of Internal Medicine and Intensive/Critical Care medicine.
- These highly competitive paid internships are offered to qualified applicants based on high school academic and leadership accomplishments. The internship program begins Wednesday, June 16th through, Tuesday, August 10th, 2010. Interns will work part-time (20 hours per week), and will be paid a maximum of \$1,168 (\$7.30/hr). The work schedule is flexible but attendance on Orientation Day is mandatory for all participants.

Cincinnati Children's Hospital Medical Center – Biomedical Research Internship for Minority Students

- Through this program 5 outstanding minority students will be paired with a research mentor to pursue a 9-week full time basic science, transitional or clinical biomedical research project during the summer. This program is open to high achieving graduating high school seniors and college

freshmen from the Cincinnati area who belong to a minority group traditionally underrepresented in biomedical careers, including African American, Hispanic, Pacific Islander or American Indian.

- These competitive paid internships are offered to qualified applicants based on high school academic and leadership accomplishments. The internship program begins Thursday, June 10th through, Wednesday, August 11th, 2010. Interns will work full-time (40 hours per week), and will be paid a maximum of \$2,880 (\$8.00/hr). Attendance on Orientation Day is mandatory for all participants.
