



SUMMER OPPORTUNITIES – 2010

American Free Enterprise and Leadership Conference

Dates: June 13, 2010 – June 18, 2010

Location: University of Rio Grande campus

- This program offers students an intensive one week introduction to Entrepreneurship, Business, Economics and the benefits of Free Enterprise while earning two semester college credits. Students in grades 9-12 have the opportunity to hear local, state and nationally recognized speakers.

Northern Kentucky University – Journalism in the Digital Age Summer Workshop

Dates: June 14, 2010 – June 18, 2010

Time: 9:30 a.m. – 4:00 p.m.

- NKU Journalism faculty and Greater Cincinnati news media professionals will lead the workshop, which will cover everything from interviewing, reporting and news writing to photography, Web design and multi-media storytelling.

University of Cincinnati – Women in Engineering Summer Camp

Dates: July 26, 2010 – July 30, 2010

- Students learn about the various engineering disciplines through visiting labs, hands-on activities, and department presentations. Corporate visits are planned, including tours and presentations from engineers.

American Red Cross – Leadership Development Center (LDC)

Date: July 15 – 18, 2010

Location: Thomas More College

- LDC is a 4 day, 3 night camp for students entering 8th through 12th grade. Students will be given the training to reach their fullest potential as leaders and leave a positive footprint within their communities. Participants attend workshops and sessions on Leadership, Public Speaking and Diversity. The students meet with an array of well known community leaders who share their experiences and advice. Additionally, students will participate in either a First Aid or CPR class to receive American Red Cross certification.

Boston University – PROMYS (Program in Mathematics for Young Scientists)

- PROMYS will offer an intensive experience in creative mathematical exploration to approximately 65 ambitious high school students with an exceptionally strong interest in mathematics. PROMYS is a six-week residential program, with a per-student cost of \$2,700. (Financial assistance is available.) Georgetown University – Summer at Georgetown

- Summer at Georgetown University gives highly motivated students the opportunity to earn college credit and advance their academic skills through a variety of challenging learning experiences lasting from eight days to ten weeks. Students have the unique opportunity to learn from Georgetown faculty and alumni including former and current members of Congress, well-known journalists and authors, national security leaders and the nation's lawmakers.

- Ohio Business Week (OBW) is an exciting weeklong summer program that gives hands-on experience with business and entrepreneurship. Students learn directly from the pros how to establish and run their own company. Hosted on a college campus, students are also able to experience what campus life is like and lay the groundwork for a successful future.

University of Dayton – Women in Engineering Summer Camp

Dates: July 11-16, 2010

- This Sunday-through-Friday camp gives you the chance to dabble in engineering through hands-on, learning-by-doing experiences you can't get in high school. Guided by UD professors, you'll conduct experiments, innovate, make cool stuff, take things apart and put them back together again. You'll spend a day at a job site, meet women engineers and spend time checking out up-and-coming technology in engineering through innovation modules.

Loyola University Chicago – Pre-Collegiate Summer Scholars Program

- This program is designed for motivated sophomores and juniors who want to get a head start on their college careers. In addition to earning college credit, Summer Scholars become acquainted with college life through study, academic discussion and social activity.
- Summer Scholars can choose from several areas of study in three-week seminars or the six-week academy. In Seminar A (July 6-23, 2010) students can choose from: Convergence Journalism, Creative Writing, Entrepreneurship, Environmental Biology or Theatrical Experience. In Seminar B (July 26 – August 13, 2010) students can choose from: Law and Civil Rights, Museum Studies, Creative Non-fiction Writing, or Urban Field Studies – Changing Chicago. In the Six-Week Academy (July 6 – August 13, 2010) students choose from two college-level courses and gain an interdisciplinary appreciation of two distinct subjects.
- To apply, students must have a 3.2 GPA and must be ready for the challenge of a rigorous, study-intensive summer. Applications are available online at www.LUC.edu/summerscholars. **Early Admission deadline is March 20, 2010 and the final deadline for applications is May 7, 2010.**

Junior State of America – Summer Programs
